Code of Conduct for School Students Travelling on Buses

Information for Conveyance Committees



Conveyance committees comprise the parents/carers of distance eligible students who use a kilometre-based school bus service. Conveyance committees are not mandatory. They may be formed to assist operators in the administration of kilometre-based school bus services.

Conveyance committees (where applicable) play a role in assisting bus operators in maintaining the discipline of school students on services which is important to the effective management of these services.

Conveyance committees (where applicable) should cooperate with the bus operator and school principal to ensure that appropriate behaviour standards are maintained on the service.

Conveyance committees' role

To assist school principals and bus operators in maintaining the Code's school student behaviour standards on buses.

Conveyance committees' rights

- Safe and comfortable travel for students.
- Accurate information when discussing incidents of student misconduct.
- To be respected and treated courteously.

Conveyance committees' responsibilities

- To treat all Code related discussions confidentially.
- To adhere to the Code's processes and procedures.
- To encourage students to behave appropriately when travelling on buses.

Conveyance committees' expected behaviours

• To cooperate with bus operators and school principals in managing school student behaviour on buses.
