

Accessing the stations by car

Springfield station is located on the western side of the Centenary Highway and can be accessed from Nev Smith Drive.

Springfield Central station is located opposite Orion Town Centre and is accessible via two new underpasses beneath the Centenary Highway.

200 car spaces will be available at Springfield station and 100 at Springfield Central station.

An additional 400 car spaces are currently being constructed on Greenbank Arterial Road for Springfield Central customers and are expected to be completed in early 2014.

Ticketing and fares

Both Springfield and Springfield Central stations are located in zone 6 on the TransLink network.

If you travel using a *go* card (a smart card that stores value for travel on TransLink services), you can save at least 30% compared to the cost of a single paper ticket.

go cards can be purchased and topped up at the station office or the ticketing machines located at each station. *go* card retailers are also available at the Nextra Orion Newsagency and Springfield Fair News.



Springfield rail line opening December 2013

From Monday 2 December 2013, Springfield residents will be able to travel directly into Brisbane's CBD by train for the first time as Queensland Rail and TransLink unveil the new Springfield rail extension.

The extension, which includes 9.5km of dual track and two new stations at Springfield and Springfield Central, is being delivered as part of the \$475 million Richlands to Springfield rail extension project.

This project is an example of Queensland Rail and TransLink's commitment to providing public transport solutions for South East Queensland's growing population.

Springfield line timetable

The new Springfield line timetable will extend current Richlands services to provide over 580 train services between Springfield Central and the CBD each week.

Springfield services will be represented by a light blue colour on the TransLink network map, timetables and passenger information displays.

The new timetable will be available at translink.com.au and at key City network train stations from November 2013.

Key features of the timetable include:

- Consistent services stopping all stations between Springfield Central and the CBD
- Services every 6-12 minutes in morning peak, and every 12 minutes in afternoon peak
- Consistent 30-minute departures in off peak and on Saturdays
- Services departing every hour from 7am and every half hour from approximately 10am -10.30pm each Sunday.

Springfield and Springfield Central stations

The new, state of the art stations will both feature a range of accessible and modern facilities:

- Accessible kiss 'n' ride and taxi drop off zones
- Motorcycle and car parking facilities, including four accessible car spaces
- Lifts, hearing loops and tactile ground surface indicators
- Accessible toilet facilities
- Accessible signage with braille and tactile information
- Visual and audible information, including electronic passenger information screens
- Customer seating
- Closed circuit television (CCTV) security and lighting
- Rainwater harvesting and solar panels.



Accessing the stations by bus

A bus interchange is located at Springfield Central station, which will be serviced by routes:

- 522 (Orion Springfield Town Centre via Springfield Central station to Goodna shops/Goodna station)
- 526 (Orion Springfield Town Centre via Springfield Central station to Redbank)
- 534 (Orion Springfield Town Centre via Springfield Central station to Browns Plains).

Springfield station is also situated a short walk from route 522 bus stop on Woodcrest Way.

Improvements to the Ipswich, Springfield and surrounding bus network will be implemented in line with the Springfield rail line opening.

Bicycle storage

Secure bicycle facilities will be provided at both stations:

- Springfield: Bicycle enclosure and bicycle racks which house up to 50 bicycles each
- Springfield Central: 20 bicycle racks and a bicycle enclosure which houses up to 100 bicycles.

To secure your bicycle space, enquire with Springfield or Springfield Central station staff.
